## Battle of Vimy Ridge

France, April 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>

## Why was Vimy Ridge Important?

- Important place because of high ground in a flat landscape.
- Good view over surrounding area.



#### Impossible?

#### Germans had fortified the ridge with:

- underground tunnels
- three rows of trenches
- massive rows of barbed wire
- machine gun nests
- massive artillery

#### Lieutenant-General Sir Julian Byng

- Commanded the Canadian Corps
- Canadian troops called themselves "Byng Boys"



## Planning

- The 4 divisions of the Canadian Corps spent months planning an attack.
  - Dug tunnels
  - Practiced on similar terrain
  - Gave soldiers lots of information to prepare them
  - Used observation balloons to see German movements

## The week of suffering

- April 2, 1917 –
   started the largest
   artillery barrage in
   Canadian military
   history.
- For 1 week they fired over 1 000 000 shells.
- Attack was loud enough to be heard in London.



# Easter Monday, April 9th, Dawn

- Snowstorm
- An estimated 15,000 Canadians rose from the trenches and advanced towards the ridge in a creeping barrage (soldiers kept pace with the artillery, which paved the way in front).
- The Canadians captured most of the ridge on the 9th, and the remaining portions of it by the 12th.





## Casualties/Wounded/POWs

- 10 602 Canadians wounded; 3 598 dead.
- 20 000 Germans dead; 4000 POWs



## Vimy Ridge Today




- Vimy Ridge is now a memorial site owned and maintained by Canada.
- The two pillars represent Canada and France



 This is an artillery shell that pierced the ceiling of a tunnel at Vimy. It is still a 'live' shell.
