Environmental Science 120 – Home Learning Week 2

Outcomes:

- recognize that humans are just one part of a complex system of living things, with an inordinate impact on the biosphere, often accelerated by the use of technology
- demonstrate an understanding of the relationships between ecosystems and communities locally, regionally, and global.

Explanation:
