



## River Valley

- Consists of more than 500 km along the Saint John River

## Miramichi River Route

- Is the shortest of the scenic drives consisting of approximately 180 km

## **Appalachian Range Route**

- Is approximately 278 km in length
- Explores Campbellton, Sugarloaf Provincial Park, Kedgwick, Saint-Quentin and Mount Carleton Provincial Park
- Includes hikes through some of the world's oldest mountains, canoeing on the world famous Restigouche River and many festivals along the way
- Includes diverse cultural roots of Mi'kmaq, Scottish and Acadian heritage
- Includes both English and French speaking populations

## **Acadian Coastal Drive**

- Is the longest scenic drive consisting of 750 km along the Acadian coast
