## Science 9 – Home Learning Week 7

- When we look up at the sky on a clear night, we can countless stars spread out across the sky.
- A long time ago, sky-watchers noticed that certain patterns of stars seemed to suggest the shapes of animals, mythical heroes or gods, and other objects.
- They gave different names to the patterns they saw.
- Groups of stars that seem to form shapes or patterns are called constellations.
- Constellations have been used for thousands of years as calendars, timekeepers and direction finders by people travelling in unknown territory.
