

### CAREER OUTLOOK

- The hospitality and tourism industry employs 1.7 million people
- Most opportunities coming from the food and beverage, recreation and entertainment, and accommodation sectors.

## SKILLS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DIFFERENT LEVELS OF RESPONSIBILITY

#### Entry level

Generally, everyone in the hospitality and tourism industry begins at this level. They may
work to please and service the direct needs of a guest or customer such as food servers,
bellmen, bartenders and front desk clerks. Other entry-level positions work behind the
scenes such as dishwashers, prep cooks, and those working in laundry services.

## SKILLS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DIFFERENT LEVELS OF RESPONSIBILITY

#### Supervisor

• The majority of people in these positions are in charge of employees working at entry-level positions. They are generally promoted from an entry-level position, have extensive experience and possess the necessary skills to deal with and supervise others. They must communicate effectively, demonstrate leadership qualities and must be familiar with all duties involved, as they may need to fill-in when necessary; however, the majority of their time is spent in a supervisory role. Supervisors may be involved in hiring, training, evaluating and promoting staff, and scheduling shifts, depending on the sector.

## SKILLS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DIFFERENT LEVELS OF RESPONSIBILITY

#### Manager

• Managers are one level above supervisors, and possess years of experience and education. In some organizations, there are teams of managers. If the organization is large, there may also be assistant managers. They perform supervisory duties, depending on the organization, and oversee the supervisors below them. They must possess strong communication skills and have good leadership qualities. Some managerial positions are involved in developing policies and procedures and may report to the director of operations, the executive director or committee.

## SKILLS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DIFFERENT LEVELS OF RESPONSIBILITY

#### Executive

• Most executives have many years of experience and education. They possess leadership skills, good interpersonal skills and are very knowledgeable of the industry. They are responsible for everyone in the organization, as well as the day-to-day operations. Sometimes they may be a member of a board and report to the executive director or the board of directors. The owner of a small business would be at the executive level, as they oversee all operations of their business.
